Day 1	Depart USA
Evening	Board your overnight flight to Santiago de Chile, Chile's political, economic, and cultural capital, arriving at Santiago's Arturo Benitez' International Airport the next morning. Likely connection en route. Dinner and Breakfast served aloft.
Day 2	Santiago
Morning	Arrive at Santiago's Arturo Benitez' International Airport.

	Santiago, the capital of Chile, is a large, modern city with some 5 million inhabitants. Founded in 1541, at the southern end of the Spanish colonial empire on the Pacific Ocean, the city grew in importance after what is modern- day Chile declared independence from Spain in 1810. Chileans are an industrious, hard-working, relatively serious people and the nation has prospered as a result, with Latin America's highest living standard and fastest growing economy during the last decade.
	Santiago is located near three very different topographical regions; the Andes Mountains to the east, the lush, central wine-growing valley, and the Pacific Ocean coast with its beaches. The city and the nearby oceanside communities of Valparaíso and Viña del Mar make for an interesting and enjoyable Latin American experience.

City Sightseeing Tour

Afternoon

<u>City Signiseeing Tour</u>
Your tour giving you an overview of Santiago starts at the <u>Club Hípico</u> racing track in the traditional <u>West Side</u> residential part of town, featuring the French Art Nouveau / Beaux Arts style of architecture popular in the early 20th century. Proceed to the <u>Cousino Palace</u> , an older mansion that has been refurbished for use as a government VIP residence.
Reaching <u>Alameda Avenue</u> in the heart of Santiago, pass by <u>La Moneda</u> Presidential Palace and numerous statues of independence heroes, into the business and government center of the city. Stop at the <u>Pre-Columbian Art Museum</u> , one of the most complete collections of ceramics, ancient textiles, and other relics of the local indigenous culture.
Arrive at the Plaza de Armas main square where the Metropolitan Cathedral and National Museum are located before proceeding to the San Francisco Church and the National Library , eventually arriving at the Santa Lucia Hill where Santiago was founded in 1541.
Crossing the <u>Mapocho River</u> , ascend the <u>San Cristóbal Hill</u> on the north side of the city for a beautiful panoramic view of the capital below with the Andes in the background. Descending the hill, drive back along the Mapocho River, nearing the foothills of the Andes, and enter the modern, prosperous neighborhoods of <u>Vitacura</u> , <u>Las Condes</u> , and <u>Santa</u> <u>María de Manguehue</u> , with nice homes, manicured gardens, and modern shopping malls. The shopping district of <u>Providencia</u> , with many boutiques, restaurants and cafés, is the final area we visit prior to arriving at your hotel.

Suggestion. For those who enjoy visiting museums should consider visiting three of the city's most important museums:
Pre-Columbian Art Museum - Housed in the colonial-era customs house, this museum has a very rich collection of pre-Columbian artifacts from Central American and the Andean region.

National Museum of Natural History - This institution, which opened in 1830, houses exhibits on zoology, botany, anthropology, and archaeology.

Viña del Mar & Valparaíso – Full-Day Tour



Board your private motorcoach for a day trip to visit these two charming Chilean coastal communities, located about 75 miles from Santiago. Crossing the coastal range of mountains through various tunnels and traversing the **Curacavi Farming Valley**, you travel down a hill where you get a wonderful view of both Viña del Mar and Valparaíso, simultaneously.

Entering <u>Viña del Mar</u>, Chile's main beach resort with 300,000 inhabitants, pass the <u>Quinta Vergara</u> museum, the <u>Plaza Vergara</u> (main square), and cross the <u>Marga</u> <u>Marga Canal</u>, where you will make a short stop at the <u>Fonck Museum</u>, featuring artefacts from Easter Island.

Continue to the fishing village of <u>Con-Con</u> with its beautiful sandy beaches and rocky coast. Return to Viña del Mar for lunch. (included in tour program)

After lunch, proceed to <u>Valparaíso</u>, a major port where many cruise ships call. The city is divided into two main sections, the coastal settlement and the hillside neighborhoods further from the sea with charming brightly-colored homes perched on the hills. These are accessed by funiculars (hillside elevators) that have a quaint appearance.

Passing the **National Congress**, we go up the **Bellavista Hill** to see "**La Sebastiana**", home to the late Pablo Neruda, Nobel Prize-winning (1971) poet. Continue on through to **Plaza Sotomayor**, the **National Navy Building**, and the **Monument to the Heroes of the Iquique Pacific War**.

Ascend the **<u>Concepción Hill</u>** and stroll along the **<u>Atkinson and Gervosani Walks</u>** for a beautiful view of the city and the port. Pass by the <u>**Baburizza Palace**</u>, eventually making your way down to the "<u>**El Amendral**</u>" Quarter, where you bid farewell to Valparaíso before returning to Santiago.

Evening Dinner on your own at a nearby restaurant.

Day 5 Santiago

Morning Breakfast at Hotel.

Suggestion (Optional Tour):

Take a full day tour to "**Isla Negra**" (**Pablo Neruda's Home**), now turned into a museum, in the Pacific coast, about two hours from Santiago. Pablo Neruda is Chile's most famous poet and writer, winner of the Nobel Prize in 1971.
